The speaker will be Dr. Alison Frontier from the University of Rochester.

"New Twists in Nazarov Cyclization Chemistry"

Dr. Alison Frontier Assistant Professor of Chemistry University of Rochester

In the past few years, reports of catalytic versions of the Nazarov cyclization have attracted renewed attention to this 4π conrotatory electrocyclization. The study of unusual variations of the reaction and their impact on the synthetic utility of the cyclization will be discussed. Applications of these methods to the synthesis of natural products will also be presented.

Alison Frontier received her AB in 1992 from Harvard, where she carried out senior thesis research with Professor Yoshito Kishi. Following doctoral work with Samuel Danishefsky at Columbia and postdoctoral studies with Barry Trost at Stanford, she joined the Chemistry Department at University of Rochester in 2002. Her current research interests include planning and execution of syntheses of biologically and structurally interesting natural products. A particular focus is the use of transition metal catalysis to rapidly construct complex molecular architecture from simple starting materials. Transition metal complexes present in catalytic proportions can often perform extremely specific transformations in the presence of complex functionality. The development of such reactions has the potential to change current trends in synthetic strategy.


DINNER:
