## MAY 2024 AWARDS BANQUET:

The four hundred and seventy fourth meeting of the Susquehanna Valley Section of the American Chemical Society will be our Annual Awards Banquet and will be held on Wednesday, 1 May 2023. With the presentation of various local section awards, the Annual Awards Banquet recognizes both aspiring and accomplished local chemistry professionals who have helped to promote chemistry, the chemical professions, and the section. This year's ceremony will begin at 5:30 p.m. at the <u>Pine Barn Inn</u> in Danville, PA. The guest speaker Jaime Jurado will deliver an interactive lecture / tasting.

# "Inquiry-based Physical Chemistry: Observable Sensory Experiments with Chocolate and lessons from the great chocolatiers"

This presentation involves participation of attendees... to taste chocolate. The term "physical chemistry" was coined by Mikhail Lomonosov at St. Petersburg University in 1752, when he

presented a lecture course entitled "<u>A Course in True Physical Chemistry</u>" where the scholar defined it: "*Physical chemistry is the science that must explain under provisions of physical experiments the reason for what is happening in complex bodies through chemical operations.*" As we enter the wonderful and ancient, noble world of chocolate, our guests tonight asked to become scientists at their tables, performing physical experiments, ask their own questions, make observations about the appearance, texture, taste and feel of their chocolate samples. Specifically, we will explore colligative properties, thermochemistry, and explore the phase rule while enjoying fine chocolates.

#### **BIOGRAPHY:**

Jaime Jurado has his B.Sc. in chemical engineering, his M.Sc. in electrical engineering, and performed study and research in medical engineering at Oxford University as a postgraduate for 30 months. His 39 years of work have been in beverages such as beer, distilled spirits, botanical soft drinks, and non-alcoholic beers, but he recently enjoyed 15 months in a large chocolate plant in Hazelton. His publications represent his work in engineering and chemistry. He has one patent pending. His last presentation to the Susquehanna Valley Section was in May 2012 when he also served as the Awards Banquet presenter. He is a past presenter at ACS and AIChE national and regional conferences. Besides the US, he has been invited to deliver chemical engineering seminars in Australia, Canada, Ireland, Germany and Great Britain. He has served as President of the Master Brewers Association of the Americas, and represented the American Malting Barley Association on a special technical visit to Kenya to present awards to researchers leading the research in fighting the wheat and barley contagion Ug99 which first presented itself to the world in Ugandan wheat fields.
